- g) To acquire or otherwise deal with land, buildings, leases, personal property, interests or rights with the object of furthering the interests of the Club.
- h) To carry on any other activities whatsoever calculated directly or indirectly to enhance further the interests of the Club, provided that any fundraising activity will be to the benefit of the Club such that profits are expended in furtherance of these Objects only.
- i) To strive for governmental and public recognition of Surf Life Saving as the authority on aquatic safety.
- j) To promote the health and safety of members and users of the aquatic environment.

### BREWARRINA Bush to Beach supporting Aussie kids January 28<sup>th</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup> 2011

Going to school in the state's northwest can mean a lot more than just getting an education: for some students it's actually a chance to spend some time at the beach.

Thanks to the commitment of volunteers from South Narrabeen Surf Lifesaving Club, Variety Australia & their supporters a group of 60 Aboriginal children last month enjoyed a true beach experience – all because they attended class.

After suffering the ravages of the weather out west, this visit was described as a “lifesaver” in more ways than one.

Recent floods have meant the Aboriginal community has been “eaten alive” by mosquitoes, has had no fresh fruit or meat & the only bread available has been flown in as cargo on light planes.

“Because of all their difficulties it was essential the Bush to Beach program went ahead this year” said Variety Australia national chairman Jack Cannons. “It inspires hope & provides a safe & caring environment”.

Now in it's sixth year, the Bush to Beach program hosts young Aborigines from Brewarrina & surrounding areas, 800km west of Sydney.

These areas, affected by drought for around 10 years, are now flooded & have been declared a natural disaster area.

Many of the young visitors have never been to Sydney or seen the ocean. They arrived at the South Narrabeen Surf Club for three days of adventure & learning, including surfing, competing in nippers' events, water safety first aid, exploring the local area, ferry trips & the opportunity to develop self-esteem & play in safety.

Saturday evening saw a sit down baked dinner with celebrities, politicians & sponsors & live entertainment.

The weekend's activities, transport, outings, giveaways, accommodation, healthy food & drinks were organized & donated by the South Narrabeen Surf Lifesaving Club, Variety the Children's Charity & their supporters.



While there is no cost to the participants, the children must attend school & behave themselves in their community to qualify for this trip.

"Many of the kids unfortunately have a sad past," said Mr Cannons. The trip is a reward for school attendance & an opportunity for the kids to see that there is another world outside their communities & to inspire hope & build self-esteem".

"South Narrabeen Surf Club is one of the smallest clubs but has the biggest heart. Their commitment to the Bush to Beach is amazing. Because of the program we are getting positive reports that truancy is down".

## SECRETARY'S REPORT

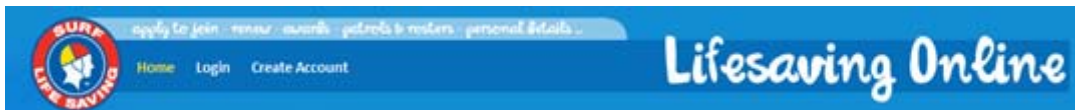

## **TREASURER'S REPORT**

It gives me great pleasure to present the financial statements of South Narrabeen SLSC for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> April 2011.

### **Financial Summary**

The Club is financially sound posting an operating profit for the year of \$4,012. This profit has been reinvested back into the Club for future spending.

As of the 30<sup>th</sup> April 2011 the Club had \$32,118 in the Westpac Bank trading bank account and a total of \$70,000 invested in term deposits.

### **Key Events during the Year**

#### **Facility Development Program – Grant \$370,000**

The Club was successful in receiving a grant of \$270,000 in March 2010 and a further \$100,000 in March 2011 from Surf Lifesaving NSW, to assist with the cost of the Club's extensions for an upgrade to amenities and the establishment of appropriate female facilities; a lift and addition of a training facility for VETAB training; compliance with OH&S issues.

#### **Donations and Gifts – net profit \$43,779**

During the year the Club received tremendous support in the form of cash donations. We wish to thank all those who have contributed; we continue to be extremely grateful. Please see summary at end of treasure's report.

The Club also thanks our honorary auditors Wong & Mayes Chartered Accountants.

#### **Ocean View Room – net profit \$20,685**

The Club's premises continue to be a popular function centre. This provides the Club with a beneficial income 12 months of the year.





**NOTE 1 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.



Surf Boat rowing is alive and well with two new female crews competing for the club this year plus a solid group of young men who have been developing over the past couple of years into very competitive boat crews.

Lots of training and time goes into preparing the boat crews to be able to compete at a very competitive level in one of the toughest branches for surf boat competition in the country. Almost every week our crews row against the best crews in their respective divisions with some outstanding results achieved at times and more pleasingly more consistency throughout the season.

Mick Haven is to be congratulated for all the work he puts into our ageing fleet of surf boats. Maintenance and repairs are always tasks Mick is undertaking during the week, ably assisted by his offsider (some would say permanent hip attachment) Bryce Hay who has also really stepped up to the mark this year. Thanks to both of you on a job well done. Mick has also taken to the big stick (sweeping), taking on the coaching and development of two crews whilst rowing and training in a competitive reserve crew at the same time. He was ably assisted by (Dans Dad) who was also a great support throughout the year. The highlight being the BBQ banquet served up at Pacific Palms on the Saturday night. It is always great to have some family support around the team when we are away and we encourage any club members who want to come along on a trip to stick their hands up and let us know, you are more than welcome any time. Welcome and congratulations to our two U/23 female crews who got through their first year of rowing (the toughest) with flying colours. Yes, some tough times were had throughout periods of the year however everyone has seemed to handle these situations and has learned from them for the future. The two crews were known as "The Stingers" and "Fish on the Floor". The Stingers are Jo, Jess, Dan and Emily and the Fish are Mel, Bec, Sim and Jaq. Well done to all of you, your bravery was tested at times in big surf and you should all be very proud of yourselves on what you have achieved this year. A welcome addition to our rowing family.

As we had more crews this year than we have had in a while the awards were hotly contested. The three awards are 'Rowers Rower', which is like players player, voted on by the rowers. 'Rower of the Year', voted on by myself and Mick (the sweeps) and Competitor of the year, which is voted on by the committee.

Rower of the Year went to Oliver Cross (Olly). Olly has rowed in two crews this year (Forty Nil & Nuffies), which meant doubling up and most carnivals after January this year. His attitude, training and all round commitment this year has been outstanding and he is a very deserved winner of this award. Well done Olly!!!

Rowers Rower was awarded to Bryce Hay. As I have said previously Bryce assisted with boat maintenance and repairs, plus towing boats throughout the year. His training and leadership of his crew plus filling in for the other crews when asked without hassle were some of the reasons why he won this award. He is also a tough little bugger after having 15 stitches inserted into his index finger one week before state titles after a tow bar/surf boat accident and rowing at a very high level with the injury and without complaining. Well done Bryce.

The Competitor of the Year was awarded to an entire crew, which this year was the Colts crew, Forty Nil. Swept by Micka, with Tuck, Bryce, Olly and Sean. These guys were the most consistent crew throughout the year and managed to qualify for the last day of State and Aussies, which is a great effort. They trained hard all year and really saw the benefits of that training pay off towards the end of the season especially. Great work Forty Nil (shame about the name – Go the Chooks).

Some rowing highlights of the year included the Junior Crew (Kieran, Lloyd, Heath and Olly) winning a silver medal at the 'Best of the Best' held on Botany Bay due to surf conditions. The boys rowed in flat water and were very competitive with the best junior crews in the state. The crew also made it through to the Sunday at the aussies, which was a highlight for them with more to come next year as colts.

Other season highlights included the colts (Forty Nil) making the last 18 at the aussies and also the Juniors (Nuffies) doing the same at the aussies. For their first year the 'Fish on the Floor' achieved some excellent results, making some finals throughout the year and having a great result at Pacific Palms.

Below is a summary of all of the crews who competed for South Narrabeen this year and their respective highlights:

**Reserve Crew (Open Men): Luke, Dave, Mick and Rohan, swept by myself.**

Lots of changes this year with Luke moving from bow to stoke (a huge change), which he handled well and without hassle. Lots of hard training was put in by these boys who as the senior rowers of the club showed the way. They row in the toughest division of rowing in regards to numbers and have to row more races than others to make a final. The boys made several finals throughout the year at the local Carnivals however their best result was the huge Manly carnival where they made the last 8 only to be DQ as a result of their sweep being a wood duck and missing a gate can. At the state and aussies they rowed very well and were unlucky to be knocked out in the last round of the day at both carnivals before qualifying for the semi finals.

**Colts Crew (Forty Nil): Tuck, Bryce, Sean and Olly. Swept by Micka.**

As stated earlier in this report an excellent year for these boys. They trained hard all year and were committed to the cause. The boys made several finals throughout the year and qualified for the last day at state and aussies. They will also claim a dodgy victory over the reserve crew at Fishermans during training as a career highlight. Colts is a very quick division, these boys have another two years left in the division and with the Wood Ducks in the same division next year we should see some really pleasing results.

**Colts Crew (Pickles): Mat, Kieran, Heath and Lloyd, swept by myself.**

Three of the crew can still row juniors so that is what we did, row both divisions from January this year with Olly coming in for Mat due to age restrictions in juniors. The Colts punched above their weight and although no finals this year they trained their hearts out and this will pay off in the next two years as the progress into colts full time. They are a great bunch of guys and fun to be around. Their training attitude from January this year was spot on and I am very proud of the way they rowed at aussies in challenging conditions.

## CLUBHOUSE DIRECTOR'S REPORT



There has been a dramatic change in the appearance of the club over the past 12 months. The last time any work was done to the club in this scale was back in 1970 when the old Club house was rebuilt. We still have a bit of work to do. Unfortunately we are a bit behind where we wanted to be with progress being delayed due to some last minute design concerns and having to work around the Surf Life saving season.

### 1960

Everything is now full steam ahead and I expect that all the building work will be completed before the start of the 2011 – 2012 season.

There has been a bit of confusion and misguided information being passed around the club relating to the building works. Most members don't realise that there are 3 different projects happening in relation to the building works.

The first is the work being carried out by Warringah Council which is partially funded from the \$700,000 allocated by Warringah Council in 2009 and other Government funding.

This work involves:

- Repalcment of the roof (completed)
- Repalce the upstairs ceiling (completed)
- Render and paint the external of the building (completed)
- Repalce the handrails
- Replace the doors and windows
- Resurface the balconies
- Rebuild the upstairs toilets an (completed)

The installation of the lift is being done as a joint project with the club and the council.



### 2010

This work is enabeling the club to have a presentable building that will reduce the cost to the club of ongoing maintenance as well as allowing us to continue to operate the upstairs area as a function room for club members and guests. With out the funding of Warringah Council the club would have had to spend many years fundraising to be able to accumulate the funds needed for this work.



The second part of the renovations is work bein carried out by the club. This includes Upgrading of the Partol area and boat shed which was completed in September 2010. Other work to be completed includes the renovations to the gym and nippers area and the building of the members amenities area. This is due to be completed for the start of next season. This work is being funded by a \$270,000 government grant which was applied for in 2009.

The third project is the lift works and storage area as well as increasing the size of the upstairs members area to make way for a better training facility. This work is still to be designed and approved by the committee however I hope it will be completed by late 2012. This work is being funded by a \$100,000 government grant which was applied for in 2010.



In total we will see in excess of \$1.2 million spent on our club from Government and Council funding. If we had to raise this amount ourselves we would never have any of the work completed as it would take decades to raise the money. I think the unforeseen delays are a small trade off for what will be a new club at not cost to its members.

## 90th YEAR ANNIVERSARY REPORT

The 2010-2011 season marked South Narrabeen SLSC's 90<sup>th</sup> Year in Surf Life Saving. ## OCEAN VIEW ROOM REPORT

We have had a very successful year for the OVR considering the state of the building over the past 12 months. The Ocean View Room was closed from May to September 2010 and then closed for November to reopen in December 2010. Renovations are still continuing, but not impacting bookings. We had very good bookings in January and February 2011 compared to the long term average. Weekly hire has increased since February 2011.

Renovations completed under Warringah Council's Refurbishment include:  
New male/female and a disabled toilet in the Ocean view room.

New carpet, polished dance floor, new tiles at door entrance and at the bar servery, new glass balcony railings, new ceiling, the fire hose has been re-located. The walls in the main part of the room have been repainted. We have new glass doors/windows on the eastern side of the OVR and in the Members Bar. All 3 decks have been concreted.

Bill Hayne has had a fantastic projector donated to the Ocean View room which we can hire to increase our revenue.

- ⤴ The Bar security grills need to be upgraded to improve security.
- ⤴ The kitchen and bar areas are still in urgent need of exhaust fans.
- ⤴ The Bar requires some rubber flooring.
- ⤴ I would like to see an awning over the beach side balcony to protect the doors and to add extra room for guests at functions when raining.

Unfortunately the club was broken into 3 times in December 2010 resulting in a loss of \$1,053 worth of alcohol, mainly spirits.
